Summary of data on RI and MPJP School sector

- There are 59 RI schools and 106 MPJP schools in Australia
- There are 62,689 RI enrolments and 87,505 MPJP enrolments
- There are 24 RI school authorities and 8 MPJP school authorities (58% of RIs have only one school in their care).
- RI and MPJPs operate 10% of Catholic schools
- RI and MPJPs have 19% of Catholic enrolments
- MPJP enrolments exceed RI enrolments in all States. The difference ranges from 54% MPJP enrolments in NSW/ACT to 83% MPJP enrolments in QLD.

Between 2020 and 2022: One MPJP has opened MPJP commenced. Four RIs ceased being responsible for schools (sixteen of their schools were transferred to MPJPs and two to a diocese)
